SUM OF \$4,600, CUP
FOR OCTOBER MEETING

AMERICAN BALLOON CHAMPIONSHIP

ST. LOUIS, June 1.—A sum of \$4,600, cups and medals, will be given to winners of the American Balloon Championship to be held next October. The program for the meeting, which will be held at the St. Louis Fair Grounds, follows:

For Aeroplanes—First, \$1,000 and gold medal; second, \$500 and silver medal; third, \$250 and bronze medal.

For Dirigible Balloons—First, \$1,000 and gold medal; second, \$500 and silver medal; third, \$250 and bronze medal; best maneuvering, \$100; first prize, \$100 or cup; third, \$50 or cup; fifth, \$25. A duration prize.
