The trip from Chicago will involve

in mileage than any scheduled for one  
day during the Glidden tour—but as there  
will be no checking out nor checking in  
the tourists will find it possible to make  
the distance in one day by starting early  
and finishing late.

Robert Drach, manager of the Chicago
