Sixteen different makes of cars are represented, thirteen American and three foreign. A second prediction that all records for speed will be broken remains to be fulfilled at the events on Thursday, Friday and Saturday of next week.

### Closing Day Entries Many.

William H. Pickens, representing the Buick Motorcar Company, swooped down upon the speedway management yesterday by entering fifteen Buick cars in the various events. This number includes the new V-shaped, eight-cylinder racing car to be driven by Louis Strang. The car is said to be capable of a speed of 120 miles an hour, straightway. The full Buick team of drivers will be here.

Other entries late yesterday afternoon were those of the Jackson and Velle. Two of the former will come and one of the latter. The Velle will compete in the short events only while the Jackson cars will be scattered over various parts of the program.

Driver Eddie Merne arrived yesterday afternoon in time to enter his famous Ford racer in all the amateur events and the big free-for-all. He drove through from Chicago in a Thomas, having last appeared in the hill climb events at Algonquin, Ill.

Breath from victories at the Algonquin hill climb, the big Chadwick six, with Colgate at the wheel, was another arrival yesterday that attracted considerable attention. The Chadwick made the best time in the Illinois event and expects to get a share of the honors at the motor speedway.
