a new V-shaped, eight-cylinder racing
car to be driven by Louis Strang. The
car is said to be capable of a speed of

Other entries late yesterday afternoon
were those of the Jackson and Velle.
Both of the former will come and one of
latter. The Velle will compete in the
events only with the Jackson cars
as scattered over various parts of
the country.
