**DUKE TRIMBLE NOW IN CRITICAL
CONDITION**

BLACKINGTON, Ind., September 29. —
It is feared that Duke Trimble, one of the big centers of the Indiana football squad, is dying as the result of a severe case of black blister caused by an infection from a splinter he has lost. The splinter is estimated to be about one inch long and is taken to the hospital yesterday. Duke Trimble has made the hospital one of his headquarters since he was struck, but his condition is still critical. The leg is being treated and he is expected to return to the team in a few days.

Mr. E. J. Clark, of Indianapolis, chairman of the board of the Indiana football association, has been notified of the injury and is expected to arrive in Blackington today to see the player. Mr. Clark, who is a member of the board, was in charge of the team's training camp at Blackington, Ind., and the player was struck by a splinter while playing football.

His leg is swollen twice its normal size and has been taken to the hospital. At noon Trimble has hardly recovered one at his bedside. He is in a stupor, half unconscious and his leg is terribly painful. It was opened in a room, but he was not conscious of any pain.

Dr. E. D. Clark, a specialist, was called and arrived in Bloomington together with his mother, Mrs. Clark, who was telegraphed to come to the hospital and she arrived here at 12 noon.

Blister Caused by New Shoe

Trimble's injury occurred in a game of football. Although a member of the team, he had not opened, two weeks ago, a blister on the heel caused by the use of a new shoe. When the blister opened, the pain was so severe that he let the pus out of it by burning the skin with a stick. The burning caused a soreness of the foot. The injury irritated and prevented him from playing football.
