He fell twice in his normal sleep and was taken to the hospital yesterday noon. Trumbull has had his second one at his bedside. Today he was stupor, half unconscious and when his leg is terribly swollen and was opened in hopes that he would be not conscious of pain.

Dr. E. D. Chase, a dermatologist, was sent for and arrived in Bloomington yesterday together with Dr. J. C. McElroy, his charge of the football team. His mother, Mrs. Eliza McElroy, was telegraphed yesterday noon to come to Bloomington and she arrived here at 1:30 this evening.

Blister Caused by Poor Game of Football.—Trumbull, a member of the Indiana football team, opened, two weeks ago, a regular blister on the heel caused by the use of a new shoe. When the doctor took about three weeks ago, and before operating on the heel, caused by the use of a new shoe. When the doctor took the pressure off of the heel, he let the pus out of the skin with a sterilized scalpel. The doctor did not realize the severity and importance of football.
