BIDS WILL BE OPENED AT ST. LOUIS NEXT WEEK.

CONTESTS AT THE SPEEDWAY

E. A. Moross, director of contests for the Indianapolis motor speedway, will go to St. Louis next week to attend a meeting on Monday of the Federated Aero Clubs of America, of which the Indiana Aero Club is a member. At that meeting the bids for the biggest aeronautical events of 1910 will be opened and Moross hopes some of them will be awarded to the Indianapolis speedway.

The events include the national balloon race, the international balloon race, the national aviation meet and international aviation meet. The national events in both instances will precede the international contests and will be on the order of preliminaries. The Indianapolis speedway officials have entered bids for all these events, but the competition is expected to be keen. While in New York recently Mr. Moross filed the Indianapolis bids, which are on a percentage basis, Baltimore and St. Louis are among the principal contenders and both have offered big guarantees.
