WASHINGTON, September 8.—Members of the Aero Club of America who live here are wondering if Indianapolis will put in a bid for the aviation carnival which the club proposes to hold in some American city next year. St. Louis and Cincinnati have already indicated that they will bid for the carnival, and the national capital is preparing to ask for it. One of the conditions named by the Aero Club is that the city obtaining the carnival shall put up a guarantee fund of at least \$100,000. The city or the organization under whose auspices the carnival is conducted will be permitted to charge an entrance fee, and the assumption is that receipts will exceed the guarantee fund required. Members of the club talk as if Indianapolis would stand an excellent chance of getting the carnival if the invitation should be made and proper effort put forth.

WASHINGTON, September 8.—Members of the Aero Club of America who live here are wondering if Indianapolis will put in a bid for the aviation carnival which the club proposes to hold in some American city next year. St. Louis and Cincinnati have already indicated that they will bid for the carnival, and the national capital is preparing to ask for it. One of the conditions named by the Aero Club is that the city obtaining the carnival shall put up a guarantee fund of at least \$100,000. The city or the organization under whose auspices the carnival is conducted will be permitted to charge an entrance fee, and the assumption is that receipts will exceed the guarantee fund required.
