

Events for Motor Speedway Meet.

The program for the events for the race meet of Aug. 19, 20 and 21 at the Motor Speedway will be made up from the following events, which are on the entry blank. As these events fill they will be placed on the official program, while the arrangements for heats and finals will be decided. The program will not be issued until the first day of the meet. - Event No. 1—Five miles stripped chassis cars of class No. 4, 161 to 230-inch displacement.
- Event No. 2—Ten miles, stripped chassis cars of class No. 3, 231 to 300-inch displacement.
- Event No. 3—Five miles, stripped chassis cars of class No. 2, 301 to 400-inch displacement.
- Event No. 4—Ten-mile free-for-all handicap race. Open to all cars entered at the meet. Cars will be handicapped in accordance with their performances by the board of official handicappers.

Three hundred miles, for cars of the piston displacement of 500 cubic inches or less, minimum weight 2,400 pounds under class F. Additional events will be added as the entries demand them, while the program will be made up as entries are received.

MOTOR CABS OUST HORSES.

State Rights Increase in "Old Time" Vehicle Everywhere.

Motor cabs being used in 100 cities for transporting the poor to be charged passengers are making rapid inroads on the horse-drawn cabs, which have not survived. Reports from almost every city indicate that the horse-drawn cabs are being replaced by motor cabs. In many cities, the horse-drawn cabs are being used only for the transport of the poor, while the motor cabs are used for all other purposes. This is a significant change in the way of life in many cities, and it is expected that the motor cabs will continue to increase in number and use in the future.

Motor cabs fitted with taximeters for determining the fees to be charged passengers are making rapid inroads on the horse-drawn vehicles, both here and abroad.
