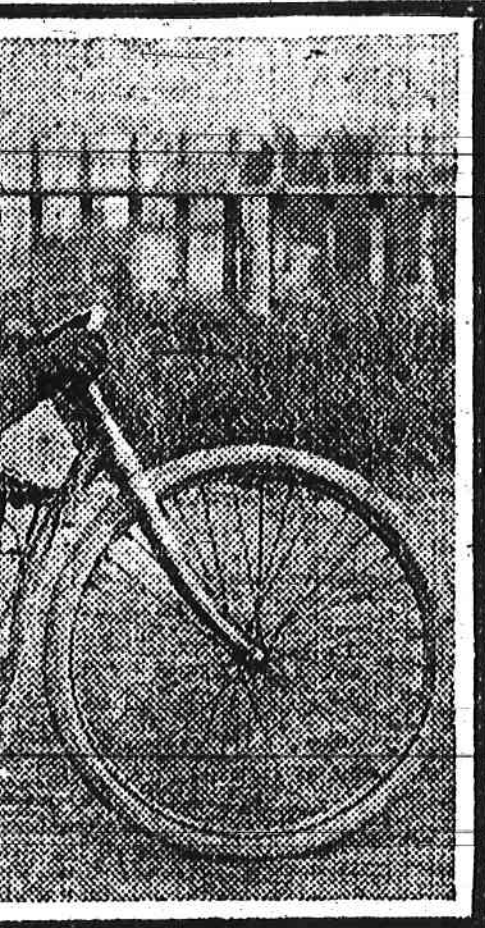

This raises the total to sixty-one cars that will whirl around the Hoosier five-mile course in pursuit of records and prizes.

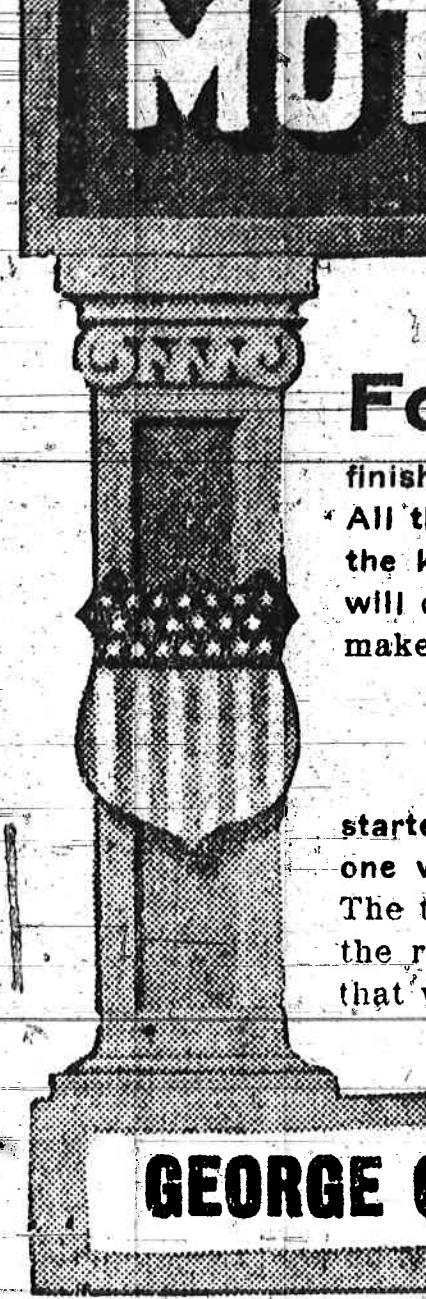
Walter Christie, who will engineer his monster greyhound creation of speed, arrived last night and swells the ranks of famous drivers here waiting for an opportunity to test their machines on the track. The motorcyclists have the right of way at present, but motor cars will probably begin limbering up Sunday. The Buick squadron, fifteen cars strong, with an army of thirty expert factory mechanics, who will groom the racers at the Speedway garages, will arrive Monday.
