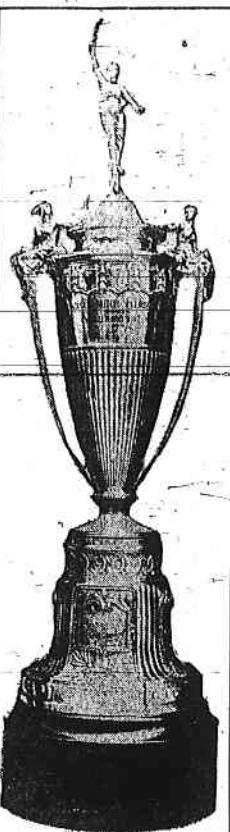

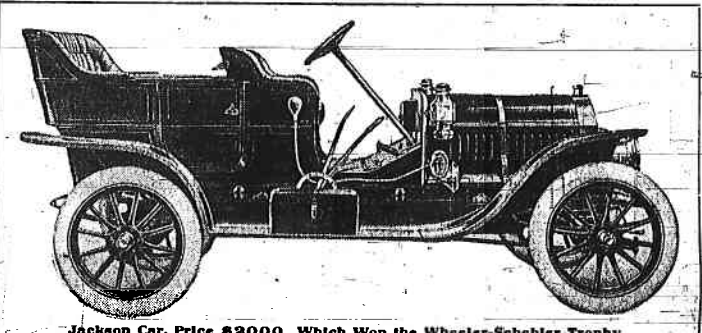
Wheeler-Schebler Trophy Won by the Jackson Car

The plans of the Speedway Company for the next meeting have not been formulated.
