### The Official Program.

Third—Five-mile handicap, limited to the members of Indiana Motorcycle Club.

Fourth—Ten-mile F. A. M. national championship.

Fifth—Five miles for machines less than fifty-five cubic inches piston displacement without auxiliary exhaust ports.

Sixth—Ten-mile professional.

Seventh—Five-mile open handicap.

Eighth—Twenty-five miles, open for machines less than 30.50 inches piston displacement.

#### —Second Day's Racing—

First Event—Two-and-one-half-mile handicap, limited to private owners.

Second—Five-mile national championship.

Third—One-mile trials, flying start.

Fourth—Ten-mile handicap.

Fifth—Five-mile professional.

Sixth—Ten miles, open to machines of less than 30.50 cubic inches piston displacement.

Seventh—One hour F. A. M. championship.
