The running time for the entire distance will average about eighteen miles an hour, as the national organization discourages attempts to break state speed laws. Every contest: ant checking in ahead of time will be

penalized. Gold medals will be awarded those making perfect scores. To those riders making a score of not less than 900 points a silver medal will be given. Bronze medals will be awarded in each class to every rider finishing the course within wo hours of schedule limit each day. There will be a hill climb at Connersville, this being a part of the endurance run. Each contestant will be permitted a 150-yard start, and if he gets up the hill without recourse to his pedals he will be marked with a perfect score.
