MOTORCYCLISTS NOT TO ATTEMPT SPEED RECORD

ENDURANCE RUN TO BE SAME AS
 GLIDDEN TOUR.

RIDERS GET ENTRY BLANKS

[By Carburetor.]

Entry blanks have been sent to all rid-
 ers in America affiliated with the Federa-
 tion of American Motorcyclists for the
 annual endurance run, to be held Tues-
 day and Wednesday of convention week
 in this city. This run is to the motor-
 cyclists what the Glidden tour is to the
 automobilists. It is open only to ama-
 teurs, and they are divided into two
 classes, A for private owners, and B, for
 riders engaged in the trade.

According to the F. A. M. rules, an en-
 durance run must average not less than
 150 miles a day. The motorcycles used
 must be stock machines and can not be
 over sixty-one cubic inches piston dis-
 placement, which means not over a
 7-horse power engine. No "freak" ma-
 chines are allowed in any runs or track
 meets conducted under an F. A. M.
 sanction.

In order to enter the endurance con-
 test the riders must file their entry
 blanks by August 5 with Chairman G. H.
 Hamilton, of Indianapolis. All contest-
 ants must be at Cleveland, O., the start-
 ing point, by 10 o'clock Monday morning,
 August 9. Machines will be sealed at
 this time and made ready for the start
 at 6 a. m. Tuesday. The first day's run
 will be to Columbus, O., 173.7 miles. The
 second day's run will be to Indianapolis,
 188.3 miles.

Will Not Try for Speed Record.

Each rider will start with one thousand points, and will be penalized according to a fixed schedule. The running time for the entire distance will average about eighteen miles an hour, as the national organization discourages attempts to break state speed laws. Every contestant checking in ahead of time will be penalized.

Gold medals will be awarded those making perfect scores. To those riders making a score of not less than 900 points a silver medal will be given. Bronze medals will be awarded in each class to every rider finishing the course within two hours of schedule limit each day.

There will be a hill climb at Connersville, this being a part of the endurance run. Each contestant will be permitted a 150-yard start, and if he gets up the hill without recourse to his pedals he will be marked with a perfect score. The time made in going up is not to be considered.
