There was an enthusiastic meeting of the Indiana Motorcycle Club last night at the clubrooms, 444 West Vermont street. The national convention will open a week from Tuesday and the local motorcycle club is putting forth its best efforts in order to prepare entertainment.

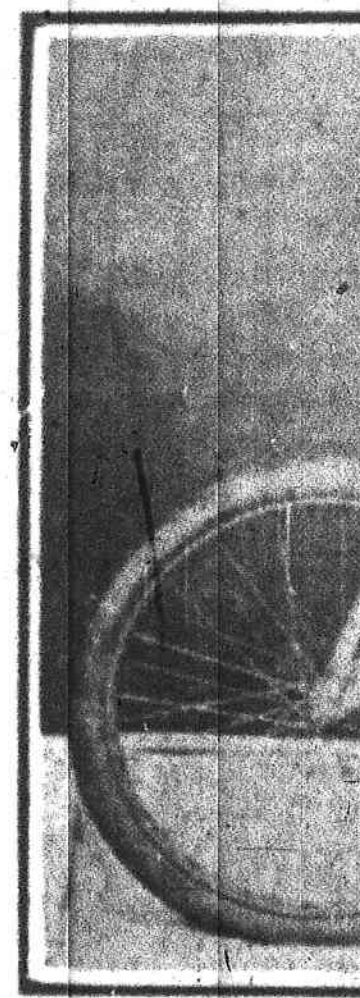
Manufacturers from all over the country have contributed liberally in the way of silver trophies and also merchandise prizes such as tires and lamps. There will be at least 150 entries for the two days' racing and every one who enters naturally figures on getting in the money. There will be prizes hung up for first, second, third and fourth places in each event.

One of the first prizes will be a \$500 silver cup, donated by the G. & J. Tire Company. This cup is thirty-six inches high and the most elaborate ever offered for a motorcycle race. All the cups will be on exhibition in Marott's shoe store window next Friday.

Word comes from the various factory riders that they will all be here prepared to lower all records from one mile to a hundred. Freddie Huyck, of the Indian factory, will arrive the first of next week. Lingenfelter, of the N. S. U., a foreign company, is on his way from Los Angeles, where he has been breaking records on a three and one-half lap track. Charlie Merz will ride as a professional for the N. S. U. people. Johnny Merz will be on a Thor.

The track will be entirely new to these factory riders, as it will to the local men.

Huyck writes that he will arrive in
 plenty of time to practice several days
 in order to accustom himself to all the
 vagaries of the speedway. He will
