## PATHFINDER CAR DEPARTS

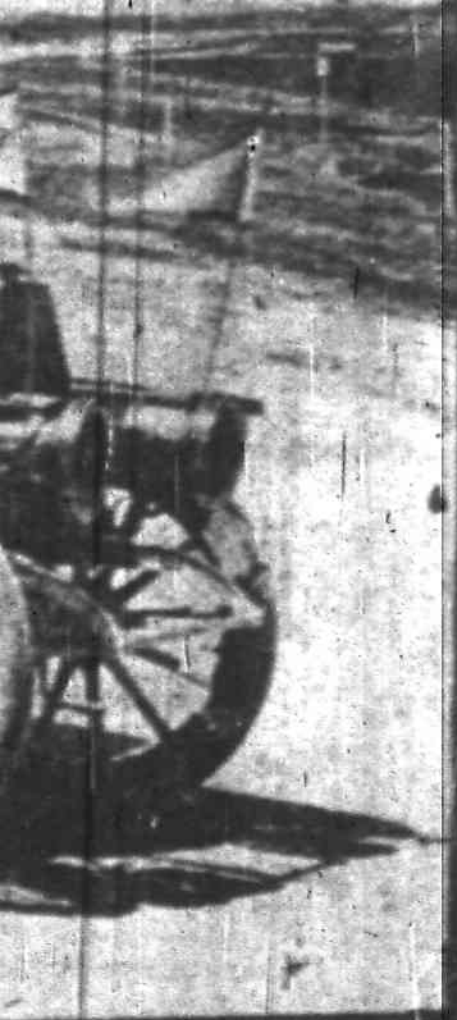

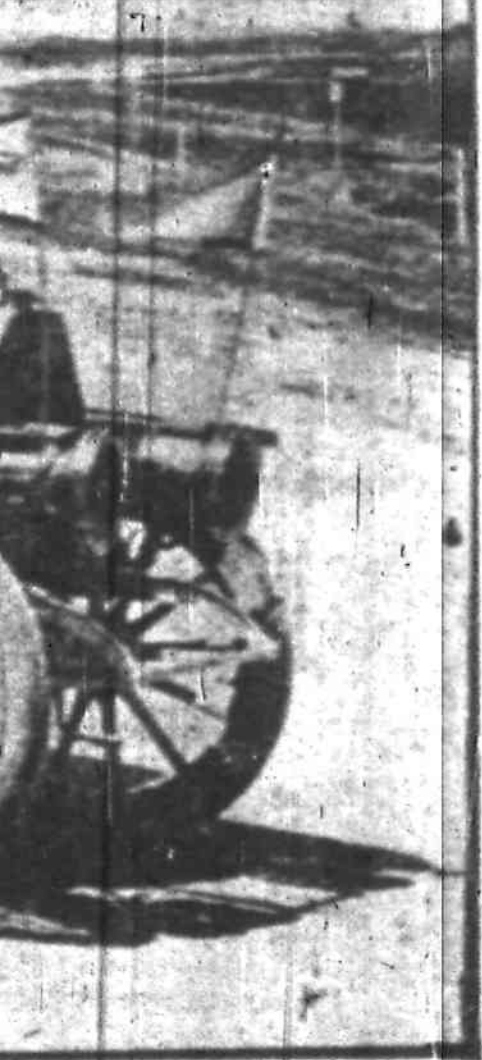
