This is the motorcycle that clipped nine minutes off the twenty-five-mile track record at Point Breeze track, Philadelphia, on its first appearance out of the factory. It was shown once since at the national hill climb in New York, where Kellogg was badly injured as a result of colliding with a number of motorcyclists standing on the track. The company will have a large number of entries in the national endurance run from Cleveland, one team of seven riders alone coming from Erie, Pa.

Cleveland Riders Cover Course.

As a result of a run made over the F. A. M. endurance course from Cleveland, O., to Indianapolis yesterday one perfect score was registered. L. J. Miller and P. B. Whitney, of Cleveland, made the run on their own Indian machines, reaching here at 5:30 o'clock, after obeying all the rules of the tour and keeping on schedule time.
