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PLAN 562 MILES OF AUTO RACES IN MAY

Speedway Promoters Book First Meet of Season for Three Days' Trials.

A. A. A. WILL HOLD EVENTS

Posts First National Champion- ship Speed Contests Ever Held on Motor Track.

It will not be long now until the noise of racing motor cars will be heard at the Indianapolis Motor Speedway, as the first meet will begin May 27 and last for three days.

In fact it will be practically two meets, the first taking the first two days and the second on the third. On the third day the American Automobile Association will conduct its first national championship track events.

In all there will be about 562 miles of speed contests. The first day there will be nine events with a total distance of 155 1/4 miles. The second day there will be eight events with a total distance of 251 miles, and the third day there will be sixteen events with a total distance of 156 miles. The shortest race will be on May 27, a quarter of a mile speed trial, and the longest will be on May 28, a 200-mile event for the famous Wheeler-Schebler trophy.

E. A. Moross, director of the contests, who has mapped out the extensive program, has tried to shuffle the events according to distances so to give the drivers chances to rest and keep things happening with a snap and variety that will eclipse any racing program ever before staged.

Following is the official program for the three days:

MAY 27.

Event No. 1—Cars, Class D; record trials from one-quarter mile to one kilometer; to lower world's speedway records; free for all cars; each car will be permitted to make two trials, electrically timed. For fastest time, \$50 in gold and gold medal; for second place, time medal.
