**AUTO DRIVERS TEST  
SPEEDWAY'S TRACK**

**Initial Whirl Over the New Brick  
Surface Shows Great  
Possibilities.**

**SOME FAST TIME IS MADE**

**Stillman in Marmon and Motsinger  
in Empire Feature in  
Trials.**

The new brick track at the Indianapolis Motor Speedway was given its first real test yesterday when Stillman in a Marmon and Motsinger in an Empire "20" let out their cars and traveled at a speed of more than a mile a minute.

The turns were wet and slippery and the drivers did not take any chances, but on the straightaways they set a furious pace and Stillman made the two-and-one-half-mile circuit in 2:05, which was about fifteen seconds faster than the best time he made over the old track last summer. Yesterday afternoon Howard Marmon accompanied Stillman to the Speedway and was highly pleased with the brick track, which was without the sign of a bump or a wave. Stillman says it will be possible to take the turns at full speed.

**Little Car Shows Speed.**

Motsinger, in his little Empire car, covered a mile in :57, which is not many seconds slower than the time made by the big cars over the rock track at the fall race meeting. Stillman drove the same car with which Harroun won the Wheatley Hill Sweepstakes in the Vanderbilt Cup race and with which he won sev-

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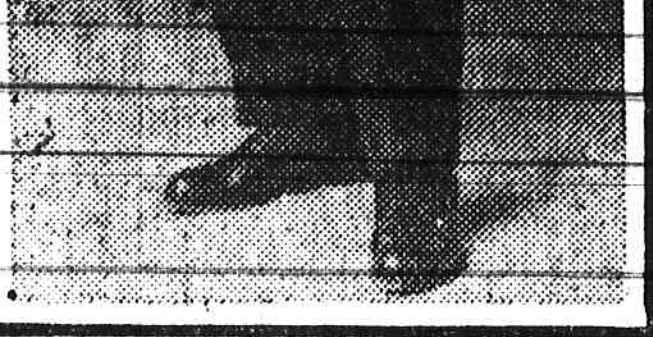

#### Little Car Shows Speed.

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Harroun will arrive in the city today and will drive his car at the Speedway this afternoon.

Walter Christie did not take his big freak racer out on the track yesterday, but he took a spin around the brick race course, inspected the turns and said he was satisfied he would be able to break the world's records in the speed trials at the Speedway Friday and Saturday. Lewis Strang, who will drive the 200-horse-power Fiat which holds the one, two and ten-mile records for American circular tracks, will arrive in Indianapolis today and he and Christie will both get their racing machines out on the track today. Christie says he expects to show a speed of better than two miles a minute in the start events and Strang is confident under the existing conditions he will be able to clip several seconds from the time he made at Atlanta. He made a mile at Atlanta in :37.71.

#### No Danger of Tire Trouble.

After setting his marks for the short distances at Atlanta, Strang said it was useless for him to try to drive his machines any faster on that track and in that climate because the tires would not stand any greater heat. With the weather near the freezing point and on the brick track here auto experts say he will be able to send the big racer as fast as the engines can be forced to drive it. It is pointed out that rubber begins to vulcanize when it reaches a heat of 120 degrees Fahrenheit and that above that heat tire trouble is bound to develop. On the brick track in winter weather there will be little danger of tires becoming soft on account of the heat.

Director of Contests E. A. Moross says the speed trials will take place on Friday and Saturday regardless of the weather. "Nothing but a snowstorm, which would cover the track to the depth of a foot or more, will interfere with the events," he said last night. "No matter if it rains or snows we will dry out the track at the turns, and on the straightaways a little moisture will not hurt anything. If the track is wet at the turns we will burn gasoline on the track and dry the race course completely before the drivers start. Nothing but a blizzard, which does not visit this country very often, will stop us from making new world's records for automobile tracks this week."
