

CARS ENTERED AND TIME MADE IN EIGHT EVENTS AT THE SPEEDWAY

FIRST EVENT.

Class 5, 160 inches and under piston displacement:

Empire, No. 10 (driven by Newell Motsinger, only entrant)—One-fourth mile in :18.73; one-half mile in :38.18; one kilometer in :48.31; one mile in 1:20.46.

SECOND EVENT.

Class 4, 161 to 230 cubic inches piston displacement:

Fuller, No. 7 (driven by Louis Sweitzer, did not enter because of broken rear axle pinion).

Cole, No. 9 (driven by Endicott, only starter)—One-fourth mile in :16.69; one-half mile in :31.70; one kilometer in :49.88; one mile in 1:05.97.

THIRD EVENT.

Class 2, 301 to 450 cubic inches piston displacement:

National, No. 5 (Aitken, driver)—One-fourth mile in :11.60; one-half mile in :23.20; one kilometer in :30.20; one mile in :49.20.

National, No. 4 (Kincaide, driver)—One-fourth mile in :11.80; one-half mile in :22.60; one kilometer in :30.20; one mile in :50.

FOURTH EVENT.

Class 1, 451 to 600 cubic inches piston displacement:

Packard, No. 12 (O'Donnell, driver—only starter from field of four entrants)—One-half mile in :27.10; one mile in :58.50.

Because of defects in starting device caused by the track wires being damaged in the fourth mile and kilometer times were not obtained.

FIFTH EVENT.

For starters that had to make up time lost in the fourth event:

First Trial—One-fourth mile in :18.86; one-half mile in :38.18; one kilometer in :47.06; one mile in 1:20.46.

half mile in :18.86; one mile, no time taken because of mistake.

Special lap, two and one-half miles, in 1:43.09.

Christie made several trials, but time was taken for but one.

First Trial—One-fourth mile in :8.78; one-half mile in :18.18; one kilometer in :23.91; one mile in :47.06.

SIXTH EVENT.

Special mile for Aitken in National, No. 6:

First Trial—One mile in :50.53.

Second Trial—One-fourth mile in :9.81; one-half mile in :21.08; one mile in :45 flat.

SEVENTH EVENT.

Free-for-all for records from five to twenty miles, with seven starters:

National, No. 5 (Aitken, driver)—Five miles in 4:06.56; ten miles in 8:12.10; fifteen miles in 12:17.01; twenty miles in 16:18.41.

National, No. 4 (Kincaide, driver)—Five miles in 4:04.73; ten miles in 8:10.61; fifteen miles (out because of lack of gasoline).

Marmon, No. 6 (Stillman, driver)—Five miles in 4:17.41; ten miles in 8:33.11; fifteen miles in 12:47.11; twenty miles in 17:03.76.

Marmon, No. 7 (Howard Marmon, driver)—Five miles in 4:25.84; ten miles in 8:50.82; fifteen miles in 13:21.18; twenty miles in 17:31.85.

Packard, No. 12 (O'Donnell, driver)—Five miles in 4:42.50; ten miles in 9:24.25; fifteen miles in 13:59.31; twenty miles in 18:31.03.

National, No. 3 (Endicott, driver)—Five miles in 4:20.31; ten miles in 8:41.84; fifteen miles in 13:27.14; twenty miles in 18:21.15.

Christie, No. 10 (Motsinger, driver)—Five miles in 4:17.74; ten miles in 8:43.11; fifteen miles in 13:11.28; twenty miles in 18:02.21.

EIGHTH EVENT.

Marmon, No. 6 (Stillman, driver)—Five miles in 4:17.41; ten miles in 8:33.11; fifteen miles in 12:47.11; twenty miles in 17:03.76.

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SECOND EVENT

Class 1, 100 cubic inches piston displacement:

National, No. 11 (Driver by Lowell Wren) only entrant—One-fourth mile in :16.72; one-half mile in :31.12; one-mile in :48.31; one-quarter mile in :10.12.

THIRD EVENT

Class 1, 101 to 110 cubic inches piston displacement:

Packard, No. 7 (driver by Louis Senniger, and not under Rennex or Standard race conditions):

Stude. No. 9 (driven by Washington, only starter)—One-fourth mile in :13.11; one-half mile in :21.78; one kilometer in :28.11; one mile in :40.91.

THIRD EVENT

Class 2, 101 to 450 cubic inches piston displacement:

National, No. 3 (Attkin, driver)—One-fourth mile in :11.60; one-half mile in :22.10; one kilometer in :30.20; one mile in :49.20.

National, No. 4 (Kincade, driver)—One-fourth mile in :11.80; one-half mile in :22.60; one kilometer in :30.20; one mile in :50.

FOURTH EVENT

Class 1, 461 to 600 cubic inches piston displacement:

Packard, No. 12 (O'Donnell, driver, only starter from field of four entrants)—One-half mile in :27.80; one mile in :58.60.

Because of defects in timing device caused by the track wires being demolished, the one-fourth mile and kilometer times were not obtained.

FIFTH EVENT

For Strang's Fiat and Christie's Christie car, Strang made three trials:

First Trial—One-fourth mile in :9.10; one-half mile in :18.84; one mile in :40.61.

Second Trial—One-fourth mile in :11.60; one-half mile in :21.96; one mile in :46.18.

Third Trial—One-fourth mile in :9.21; one-

half mile in :18.87; one mile in :40.60; time of race record.

Starting line was open because track was not dry.

Christie drove complete race, but won two halves for his car.

Chris. Christie, after starting race in :9.10, one-half mile in :18.80, one mile in :40.60, and miles in :42.30.

SIXTH EVENT

Special rules for Almquist vs. Marmon, No. 6 (Driver, O'Donnell). One mile in :10.33.

Standard track—One-half mile in :9.02; one-half mile in :18.04; one mile in :33.94.

SEVENTH EVENT

Free for all for records from five to twenty miles, with seven starters.

National, No. 5 (Aitken, driver)—Five miles in 4:04.54; ten miles in 8:11.10; fifteen miles in 12:17.91; twenty miles in 16:18.41.

National, No. 6 (Kinrade, driver)—Five miles in 4:04.73; ten miles in 8:10.61; fifteen miles (out because of lack of gasoline).

Marmon, No. 6 (Stillman, driver)—Five miles in 4:17.41; ten miles in 8:23.11; fifteen miles in 12:47.11; twenty miles in 17:08.76.

Marmon, No. 7 (Howard Marmon, driver)—Five miles in 4:25.86; ten miles in 8:50.82; fifteen miles in 13:21.18; twenty miles in 17:52.87.

Packard, No. 12 (O. Donnelly, driver)—Five miles in 4:42.69; ten miles in 9:28.85; fifteen miles in 13:59.81; twenty miles in 18:48.83.

Cole, No. 9 (Endicott, driver)—Five miles in 5:20.61; ten miles in 10:41.85; fifteen miles in 16:02.44; twenty miles in 20:22.11.

Empire, No. 10 (Motsinger, driver)—Five miles in 6:28.14; ten miles in 12:45.22; fifteen miles in 19:18.26; twenty miles in 25:50.23.
