"What speed were you going at the time of the accident?" a motor-omnibus driver was asked recently in a London court. "Oh, I should say a gentle trot," he replied.

Nearly every one of Detroit's automobile factories supports a baseball club, making that city the only one in the world to have an Automobile Manufacturers' League.

Probably the most powerful automobile engine ever built has been constructed by a Pennsylvania firm. It is of 250 horse-power, and will be used in a 12-meter motor boat.

The decrease in importation of foreign cars so far this year has been figured out at about 16 per cent. On the other hand, exports have increased nearly 65 per cent. over 1906.

From January 1 to June 1 this year 6,007 automobiles were registered in New York State. During May 2,375 cars were registered, as compared with 1,900 cars in May, 1906.

Washington University, St. Louis, is preparing to establish a chair of motor-ing in its manual training department, the new feature to be added to the curriculum in the fall.

A feature of a Neighborhood Touring Club formed at Hartford, Conn., is that the members make it a point to take along their wives and strictly observe the speed limits.
