PRINTERS KNIPPER WILL DRIVE BENZ

E, 5 TO 4 TEAMS WITH BOB BURMAN

Brown, Who Fanning & Hits. Tiedman Trophy Winner to Pilot Second Moross Car—Three Loziers Due to Arrive Here Today.

Billy Knipper will team with Bob Burman and drive the second Benz car in the 500-mile race at the Speedway tomorrow. This announcement was made by E. A. Moross, who has not yet seen the two German cars, on his arrival in the city yesterday.

Knipper has driven in many races, and with the world's speed king as a mate, the pair ought to make a good showing in the big race. Knipper won the Tiedman Trophy at the wheel of a Lancia over the grand prize course at Savannah last November, and he has driven for the Chalmers company.

The Benz that Burman will drive has a bore of 5 1-8 and a stroke of 6 5-16 with a piston displacement of 520 cubic inches. Knipper's motor measures 4 7-8 by 5 7-8 and has a piston displacement of 444 cubic inches. The two cars were imported for Moross and have never been raced in this country, but have been in events on the continent. Burman left Jacksonville last night, where he raced yesterday, and he and Knipper will test out their cars over the Long Island Motor Parkway tomorrow and Wednesday, and the cars will be shipped from New York Wednesday night.

MOROSS BRINGS STRING.

Burman and Knipper will come to the Indianapolis track immediately following their trials. Burman will drive the Benz that Bruce-Brown won the Grand Prize with over the Long Island course Wednesday night in an attempt to set a new night record, using a Remy magneto light. The remaining cars in Moross's string, the Blitz and the Prince Henry Benz, the Bulck Bug, the Darracq, the Giant Knox and the Marmon, were shipped last night in Moross's special car from Jacksonville to the Speedway. Moross is here to arrange some details with Carl G. Fisher and to get ready for his string of cars.

Ralph Mulford, Harold Van Gorder and Teddy Tetzlaff, driving their Lozier cars entered in the race, left Detroit yesterday morning and reached Fort Wayne last evening. The Loziers are accompanied by C. A. Emlae, advertising manager, and wife, and M. A. Phillips, racing manager, and wife, of the Lozier company. The party expects to arrive in Indianapolis about noon and the cars will be taken to the track to practice in the afternoon.

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BURMAN SMASHES OWN MARK.

Drives "Blitzen" Benz Mile in 55 Seconds at Jacksonville.

JACKSONVILLE, Fla., May 14. -Driv- ing through a blinding rain, Bob Burman, world's speed king, hurled his 200-horse- power "Blitzen" Benz over the Monerief Park track a mile in 55 seconds flat, breaking the state record for the mile of 55.4-5 seconds, held by himself. The dare- devil was covered with mud at the finish of his spectacular ride, and many believe he was lucky to get out alive.

Considering the conditions of the course, Burman's performance in the mile drive at the wheel of the big car was a sensa- tion and predicts great feats for the new speed king. The blinding rain came up suddenly while Burman was making his record run, but it did not interfere, and he shot the big steel steed around the course, shaking dice with death at every turn.

In the five-mile handicap, Burman, starting at scratch, drove the Bulek "Bug" over the distance in 4:13, just above the world's mark for the time. The first three miles in this event were made in 2:29, 2-5 seconds lower than the record, but will not stand as official, as Burman did not announce his intention of trying for the record.

E. Hayercraft, driving a Giant Knox against Bob Burman in the Bulek "Bug," in a special match race of five miles miraculously escaped death. Burman passed Hayercraft and the Knox was envel- oped in a cloud of dust, preventing Hay- craft from seeing the exact curvature of the turn. His machine crashed into the fence, turned turtle and hurled Hayercraft into a ditch. The gasoline tank of the Knox car caught fire and the wrecked machine was burned. Hayercraft's clothes also caught fire, but spectators snuffed out the flames.
