

WEATHER MAN FROWNS UPON TRIAL FLIGHTS

ABLE FOR AVIATION FEATS.

AEROPLANE KITES OVER CITY

Unless there should be a decided change in atmospheric conditions late this afternoon the aeroplane trials scheduled to take place at the Indianopolis motor speedway today were to be postponed until tomorrow. This was the amnouncement made by the speedway managers this morning, when a light drizzle of rain set in and the lowering clouds made it apparent that conditions for aviation feats would be anything but favorable.

Roy Knabenshue and his crew of Wright aviators arrived in the city early this morning from Dayton. The birdmen spent most of the day in the big aerodrome at the speedway turing up their machines and getting then in shape for the many fears they expect to perform next week. Knabenshue is enthusiastic over the outlook for a successful meet in Indianapolis and says the weather alone can prevent his bird-men from attracting world-wide notice.

The Indianapolis meet will mark the first appearance of most of these aviators in public flights. Their experience here-tofore has been confined to work largely at the training grounds at Montgomery. The wind wagon, which has been constructed by the Overland Automobile Company for a race with an aeroplane next week was given its first tryout at the speedway this morning. The tryout was scheduled late yesterday afternoon, but because of a delay at the factory in putting the machine in shape the trial was postponed.

In the test this morning the machine was sent around the brick course at the was sent around the brick course at the rate of fifty-three miles an hour. This was a surprise, as the car was not expected by the builders to do better than twenty-five miles with its wooden propeller. The trial was made by Carl Baunhaser, head tester for the Overland company.
