

Board of Health Recommendation in Regard to Wells.

Investigations of fifty-six of the typhoid fever cases that have been reported since July I have been completed by the city board of health. As a result the board states that while it is not necessary that alty water be boiled. It is imperative that well water, especially from wells on the south side of the city, be boiled before drinking.

Of the fifty-six investigations made, forty-seven of the patients either drank well water exclusively or to a large ex-


