CAR THROWS TIRE: GOES INTO WALL

Ray Harroun, Winner of Saturday's Big Race, Has Narrow Escape.

GREAT CROWD AT SPEEDWAY


Before Noon More Than 20,000 Persons Were in the Inclosure-Thirteen Events on Program.

INDIANAPOLIS MOTOR SPEEDWAY. May 20, Ray Harroun, in his Marmon Yellow Jacket, winner of the Wheeler-Schebler 200-mile race, Saturday, had the narrowest kind of an escape from death shortly before noon today. Miraculously he escaped injury, but his car was wrecked after it had torn a four-foot hole in the heavy cement retaining wall at' the top of the twelve-foot bank on the northeast turn of the course.

While running at full speed close to one hundred miles an hour, an exploding tire caused the driver to lose control of the car. The yellow jacket, or "wasp," it is called, struck the cement retaining wall squarely, making a breach four feet wide. The car rebounded from the wall and remained on the track, although almost a total wreck.
