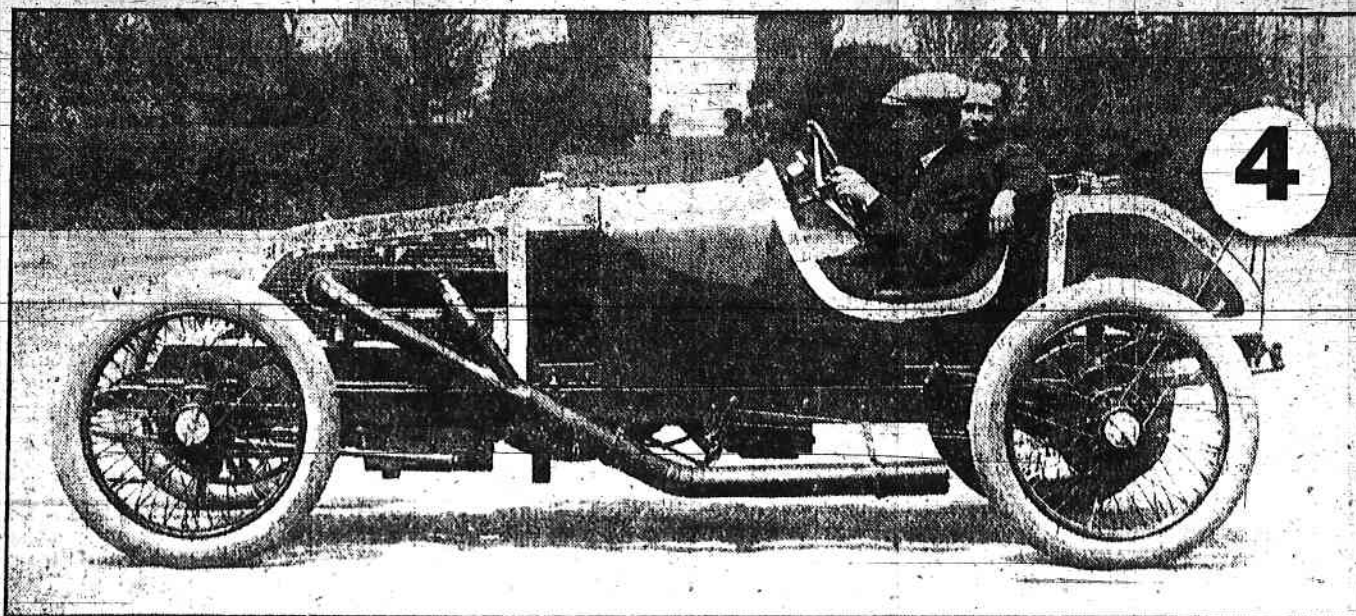

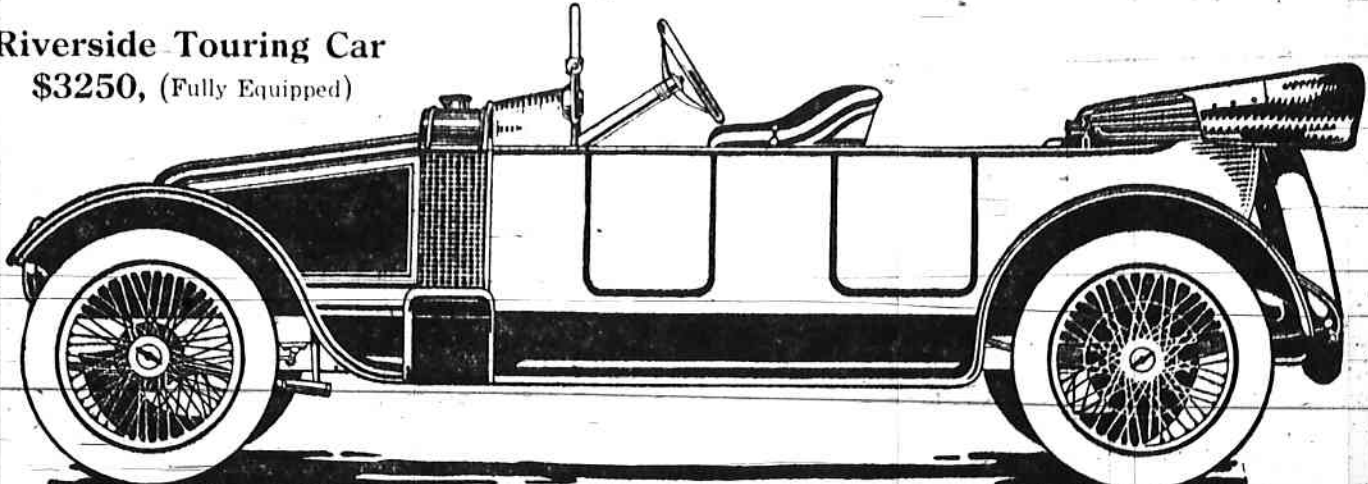


BOB BURMAN and TONY JEANETTE in KEETON RACER--MADE LAP (2 1-2 MILES) IN 1:37.45
