

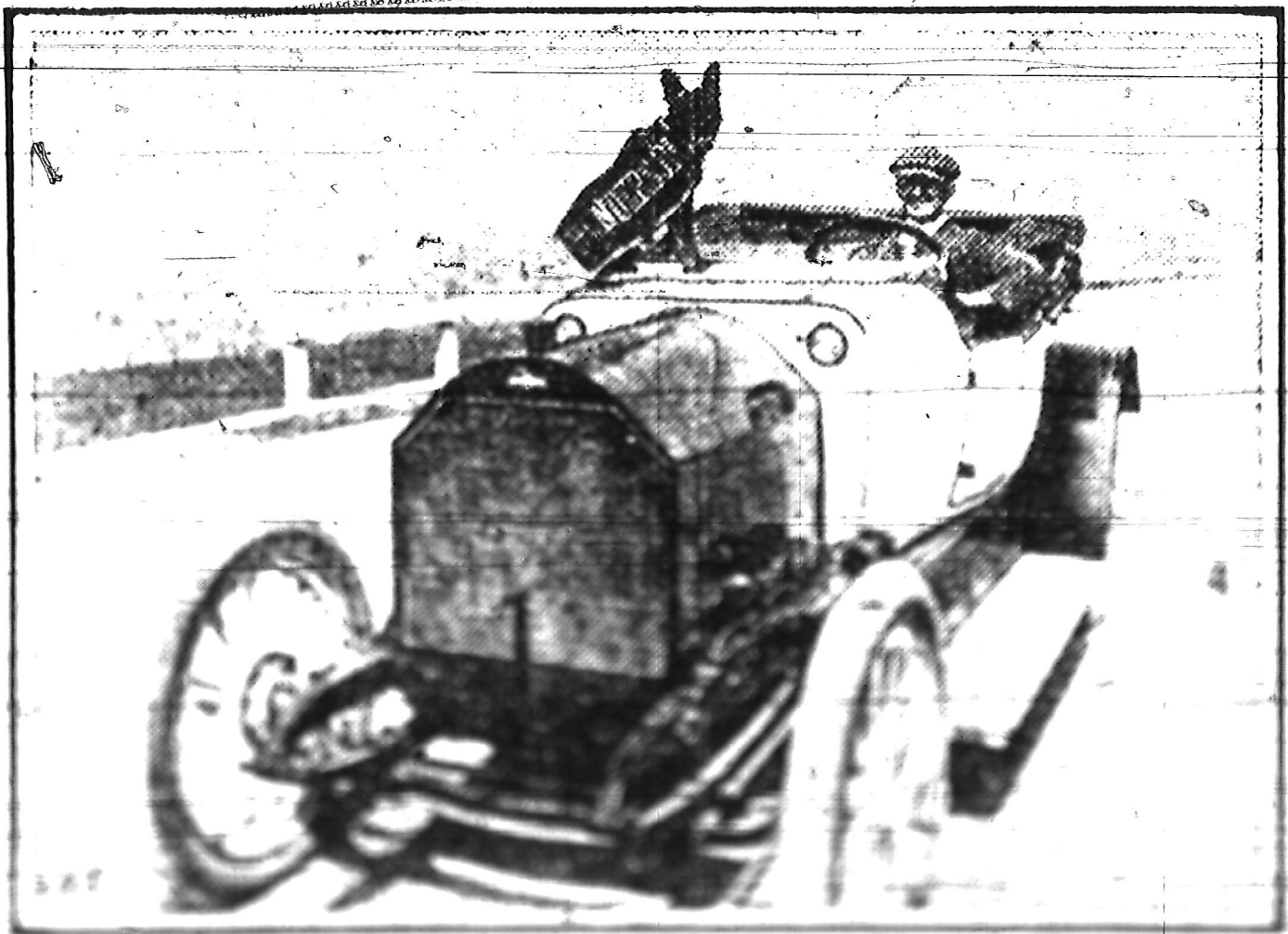
"Prince Billy" Has Bull Terrier as Mascot for Coming 500-Mile Grind

This little dog will be forced to sit for hours on May 30, wondering why his master rides away amid a cloud of blue smoke and he is not invited. Knipper



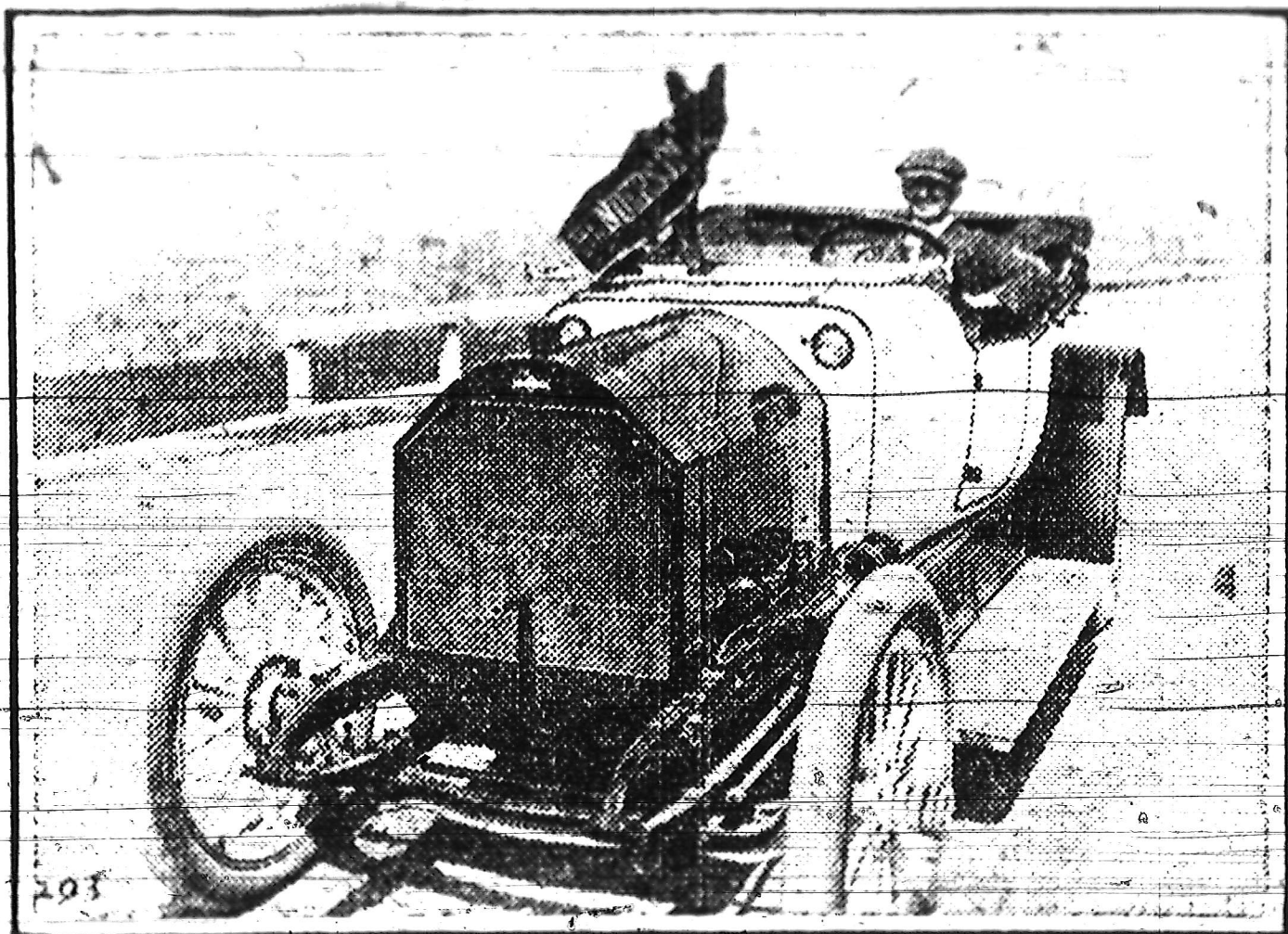
"Prince Billy" Has Bull Terrier as Mascot for Coming 500-Mile Grind

Traveling first class from Rochester,

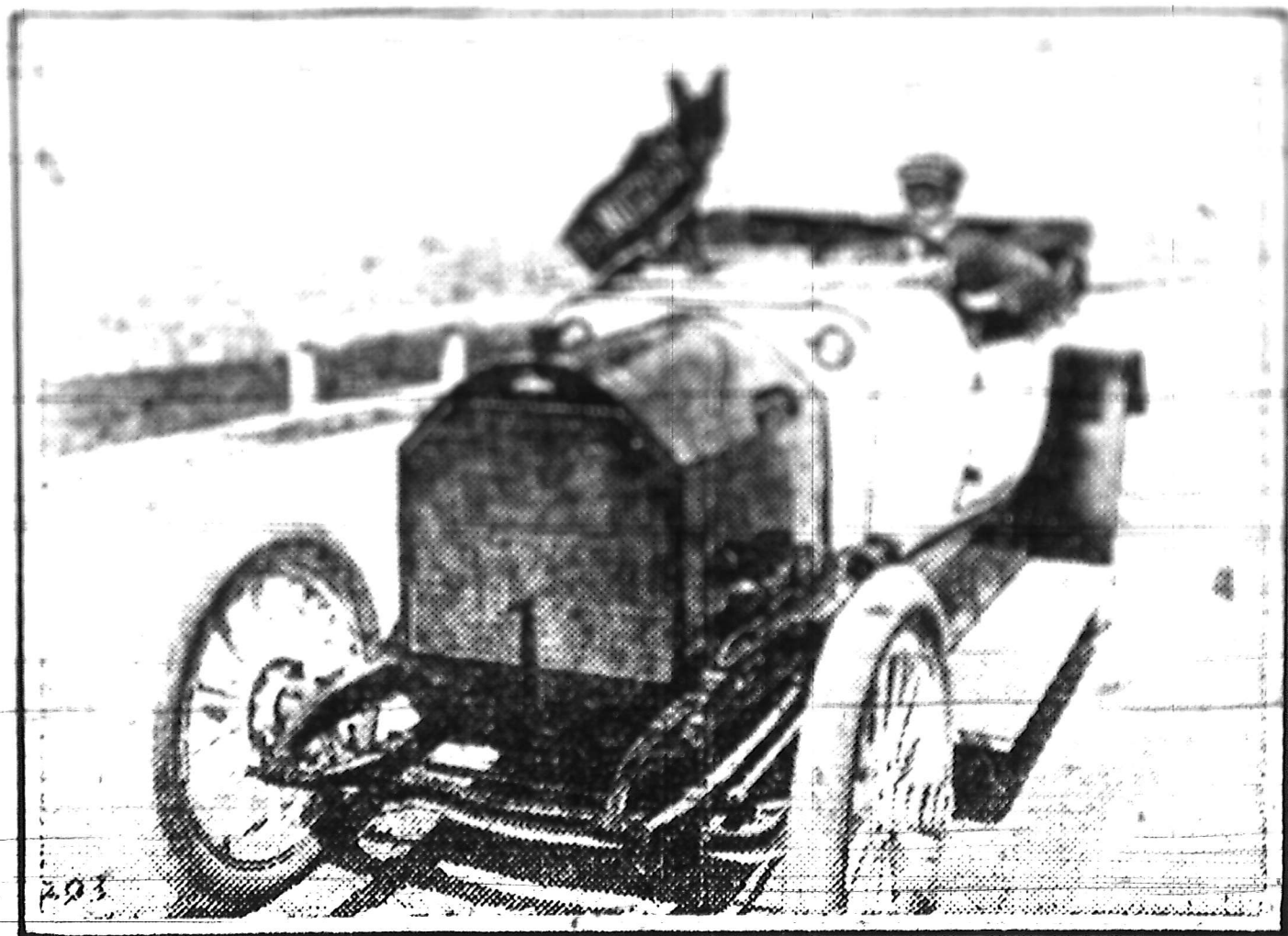
