COURT DOES NOT INTERFERE.

Will Not Stop Automobile Races
Scheduled for Lowell Course.

BOSTON, Mass., Sept. 2.—There will be
no interference on the part of the courts
with the automobile races at Lowell next
week. In the equity session of the Massa-
chusetts Superior Court today Judge
Dana refused to grant the petition of Mrs.
Ocea A. Shaw of Lowell for an injunction
against the Lowell Automobile Club, re-
straining that organization from roping
off Varnum avenue and Pawtucket boule-
vard during the days of automobile rac-
ing next week.

Mrs. Shaw in her petition alleged that
the legislative act under which the races
were sanctioned was unconstitutional.
