Plays Part In Divorce Action Brought by Detective Samuels's Wife.

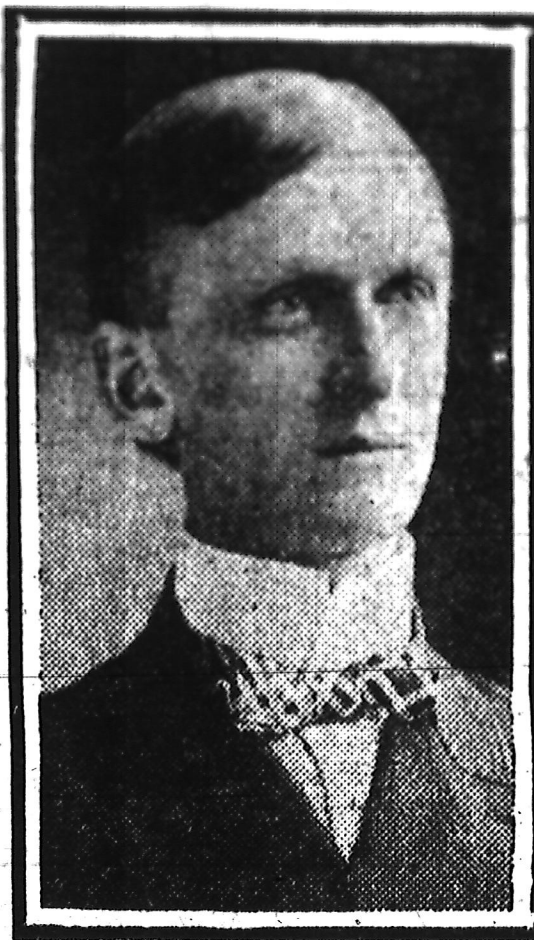
