# SPEEDWAY'S FAME GROWS

## E. MOROSS JOINS COMPANY

EXPERIENCED AUTO RACE PROMOTER  
WHO WILL BOOST LOCAL TRACK  
SHOWS BARNEY OLDFIELD WHAT  
HOOSIER STATE POSSESSES.

After Barney Oldfield had declared that the promoters of the motor speedway are not giving enough credit to the track's possibilities an increased value has been attached to the already famous Hoosier course. Oldfield said yesterday that two miles a minute could be easily attained. He expects to enjoy the swiftest racing of his novel career here in Indianapolis during the summer.

Three automobile concerns are seeking this popular driver. Indications are that he will sign a contract with the National Company of this city. He praised the National car, saying that it was "chock full of swiftness."

### Moross Joins Ranks.

Earnest Moross, a prominent automobile race promoter, has joined the ranks of the Indianapolis Motor Speedway Company and will be associated with the organization, helping make the summer's events successful. His wide experience and broad knowledge qualifies him for the stupendous task which he has begun. His office headquarters are with Carl Fisher. He will direct all publicity work.

A multitude of matters require instant attention and the busy boosters are leaving no stone unturned in their efforts to place Indianapolis at the head of all motor-racing cities in the world.

The fifteen-ton roller begins operations today. Entry blanks for the races are being prepared and will be mailed soon. A list of all the records made since auto racing began is being compiled and will be distributed broadcast. Over the top will appear the words, "All will be broken at Indianapolis this summer." The speedway colors will be green, white and brown. Pennants, flags, team colors and all will conform to the scheme.
