AWAIT ENDURANCE RUN

ALL DETAILS MAPPED OUT

**EIGHTH ANNUAL RELIABILITY MOTOR-
CYCLE TOUR, TO BE HELD FROM
CLEVELAND TO INDIANAPOLIS,
PROMISES TO BE SUCCESS.**

G. H. Hamilton, chairman of the com-
mittee on the Eighth Annual Endurance
and Reliability Run for Motorcycles, has
completed the work of laying out the
course from Cleveland to Indianapolis.

The run is to start at the Hollenden
Hotel, Cleveland, O., on the morning of
Aug 10. The first day's run will terminate
at Columbus, O., via Wooster, Coshoc-
ton and Newark, making the distance
173.3 miles. The first checking station in
the morning will be at Wooster, O. Co-
shocton will be the noon control. The
afternoon checking point will be at New-
ark, O.

The second day's run will be from
Columbus, O., to Indianapolis, via Spring-
field, O.; Dayton, O.; Richmond, Liberty,
Connersville, Rushville and Indianapolis,
a distance of 188.1 miles. The checking
stations for the second day will be Day-
ton, O., for the forenoon and Liberty, Ind.,
in the afternoon, Richmond, Ind., being
the noon control.

The Endurance and Reliability contest
is the first part of the program of the
National Motorcycle Meet, which will be
held in Indianapolis this year the second
week in August. The object of this con-
test is to test the endurance, skill and
judgment of the competitors, and the
capability, endurance and reliability of
the motorcycles they use and the con-
sistent performance of both.

It is expected that there will be from
100 to 150 entries in the endurance run,
representing practically every make of
motorcycle on the market. The entries
will be restricted to amateurs riding mo-
torcycles, the engines of which do not
have a total piston displacement exceeding
sixty-one cubic inches, and which are
not provided with auxiliary parts, but
which are provided with efficient mufflers
and full road equipment, which must con-
form in every respect to catalogue speci-
fications.

Machines to Be Sealed.

A technical committee will seal the con-
 testants' machines with such seals as
 they may select, such seals to cover the
 timers, battery boxes, magnetos and cyl-
 inders. For breaking any of the seals
 the contestants will be penalized as fol-
 lows:

- For breaking seal on timers, fifteen points.
- For breaking seal on battery box, twenty points.
- For breaking seal on magnetos, twenty-five points.
- For breaking seal on cylinder, 100 points.

Gold medals will be awarded for per-
 fect scores in Class A and B. Silver
 medals will be awarded to riders in each
 class finishing with a score of not less
 than 900 points. Bronze medals will be
 awarded to riders finishing within two
 hours of time scheduled on each day.
