

POLICE MAY ENTER RACE

MOTORCYCLISTS PLAN MEET

NATIONAL CONVENTION MAY BE ENLIVENED BY SPEED TRIALS BETWEEN OFFICERS FROM SEVERAL CITIES, AUG. 9 TO 13.

Indianapolis will be given some samples of dizzy speed during the national convention of motorcyclists, according to riders who predict broken records. Fairgrounds mile tracks have been the stamping grounds for riders for many years, and therefore the records that now stand will look simple when the speeders hit banked curves on the Motor Speedway.

The promoters are also endeavoring to get up an event of motorcycle police officers from different cities. While New York, Philadelphia, Washington, Minneapolis and several other cities are boasting of their nifty riders, the local promoters believe that Indianapolis has in Officer Gibney a motorcycle rider who will carry home the honor for the fastest riding.

One rider of note who was in this city recently said that it would not be so much a question of the rider as a question of the limit of the speed his machine holds. On a fair ground track, where the rider was called upon to hold his machine in check, there has never been a race to the full extent of power. On the speedway, however, the riders can "turn 'em loose" and watch records fall by the wayside. This adds additional danger to life and limb of the daredevil speeders.
