

JOE DAWSON REINSTATED.

Auto Driver May Take Part in the Milwaukee Races.

Joe Dawson, one of the world's best known automobile drivers, and C. E. Shuart, his manager, were reinstated yesterday by the Contest Board of the American Automobile Association. The meeting of the board was held at the association headquarters, 437 Fifth Avenue, and the action of the board came as a surprise, as several efforts had previously been made to put Dawson and his manager in good standing. The case, however, was reconsidered and favorable action followed.

Dawson was suspended for driving an exhibition mile on a dirt track, without A. A. A. sanction, for the benefit of the Elks Lodge of Memphis, Tenn., July 4 last. Dawson will probably drive in the Vanderbilt Cup and Grand Prize races at Milwaukee, Oct. 4 and 5. Dawson was advised yesterday of his reinstatement and at once left Chicago for Milwaukee.

Fred E. Radina of Cincinnati, a registered racing driver, who was nominated to drive the No. 10 Cino car with which Howard Wilcox finished in second place in the 200 mile race held at Columbus, Ohio, on Aug. 25 last, but was barred because of his automatic disqualification for participating in an unsanctioned race meeting on the half-mile track at Lawrenceburg, Ind., under the belief that the Contest Board did not recognize half-mile tracks and exercised no jurisdiction over them, was reinstated to good standing because of reasonable excuse for having secured such erroneous impression from an A. A. A. official representative.
