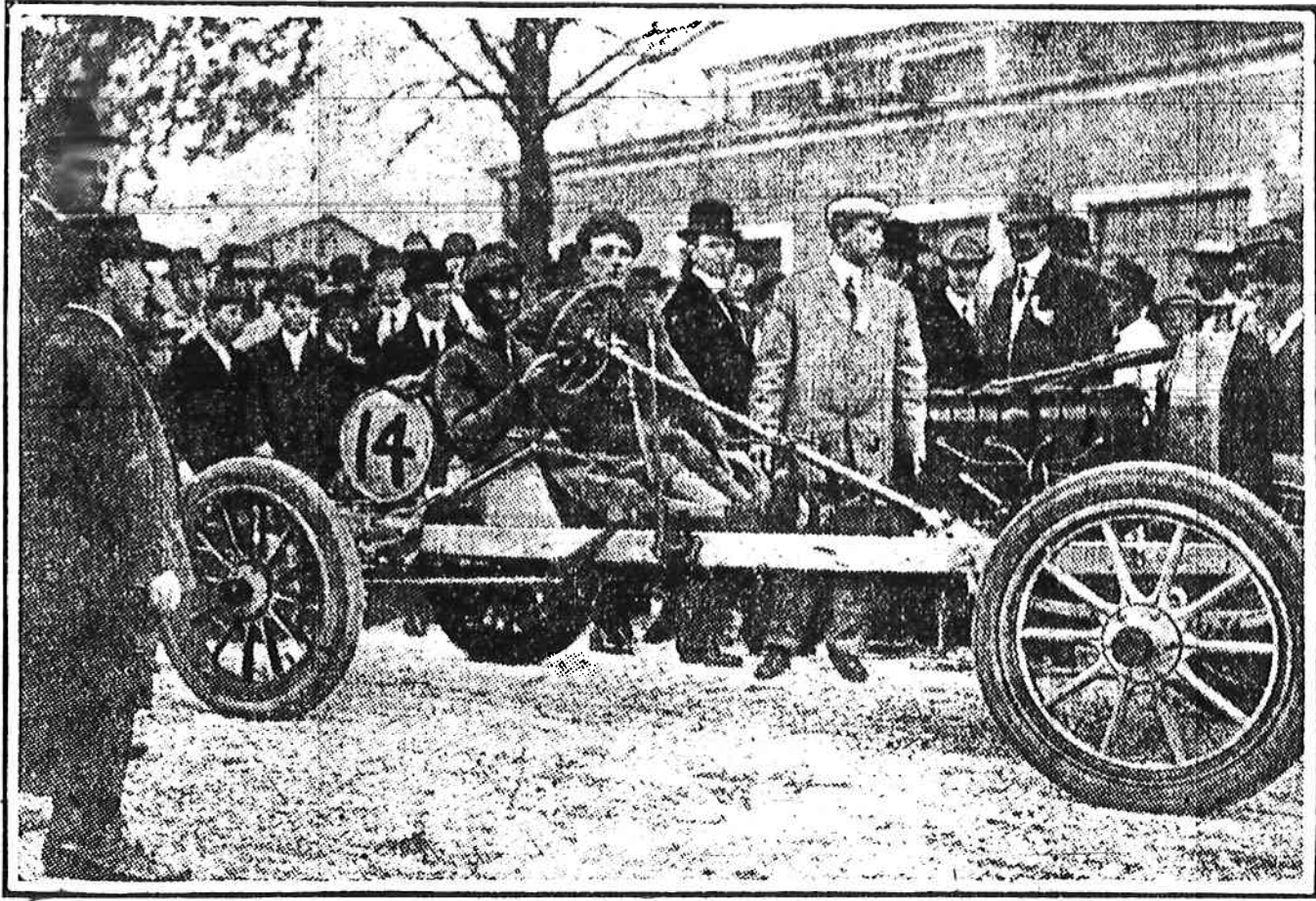

TAFT RECEIVES OFFICIAL AUTO FOR PERSONAL USE
