PARADE OF NATIONS IS FEATURE BEFORE RACE

SIX BANDS WILL PARTICIPATE
IN SPECIAL ATTRACTION.

AWAY WITH FLYING START

A parade of nations is to be a feature at the speedway at 8:30 o'clock Decoration day morning, all the cars entered in the big gasoline derby to participate. The special attraction was arranged at the suggestion of G. G. Fisher, president of the speedway company, and it will, in a large measure, relieve the congestion at the gates by attracting thousands of people to the course before the hour set for the starting of the big race, which is 10 o'clock sharp.

Six brass bands, which will be stationed in different parts of the grounds throughout the day, will be used in the parade of nations. It is planned to have the bands parade in a body before taking their respective stands. Then the racing cars are to be brought out on the track and the bands will be so coached that they will play the national airs of the different countries as the representatives pass. First will come a group of American cars, and the bands will strike up the "Star-Spangled Banner." The Peugeot drivers and cars, representing France, will follow to the tune of "Marseillaise."
