**FISHER AUTO COMPANY
 IS INCORPORATED TODAY**

**NEW FIRM ABSORBS HUNTER-
 HAMMOND COMPANY.**

CAPITAL STOCK IS \$25,000

The Fisher Automobile Company was incorporated this morning, with a capital of \$25,000, to take over the stock, personal property and good will of both Carl G. Fisher & Co. and the Hunter-Hammond Auto Company, two well known concerns on Motor row. Officers in the new firm have been elected as follows: Carl G. Fisher, president; Harry L. Hammond, vice-president, and F. Ellis Hunter, secretary and treasurer. All the lines handled by the defunct concerns will be taken over by the new one, including Stutz, Packard and Reo pleasure cars, and Packard and Reo commercial vehicles. The amalgamation of the two firms which were party to the deal is in the nature of a reunion of old business associates, as both Hunter and Hammond were intimately connected with Fisher from 1901, when he first entered the automobile game, until 1911, when his concern was dissolved to make way for the Fisher-Gibson Company. The name of the new company likewise is a revival of the past, the Fisher Automobile Company having been the original title under which the Prest-O-Lite financier's first motor car venture got its start. In view of the harmony which has always characterized the relations of the members of the corporation, as well as the varied and excellent line of cars they will have for sale, it is generally thought that the new enterprise will meet with success from the very start. Fisher's interest in the business is naturally more of a sentimental nature than anything else, it being his desire to preserve the name and the traditions of the firm whose affairs he once personally supervised, as long as he is identified with the automobile industry.
