

ITALIAN CARS FAST AS FRENCH



TRUCCO, IN ISOTTA.

The Isottas, which were shipped from Havre a few days ago, in charge of Vincenzo Trucco, the Italian factory expert, shown at the wheel of one of the cars in the above photograph, are acheduled to arrive in this city on about May 34. They will be taken in charge immediately by Tetzian and Grant, who, with Trucco, compose the Isotta team, and hurried out the speedway for practice. Though they will have only four or five days to get in shape it is thought this will not prove much of a handicap in view of the knowledge which the American drivers of the outfit have of the course. Trucco expected to get the hang of things between them,

under the tutelage of his more experienced brother drivers. That they will prove formidable contenders the opinion expressed of them by the pilots already on the course, especially the foreigners, seems to indicate. Their speed, it is said, is fully as reat as that of the Peugeots, due to the fact that they use a similar system of vulve mounting.
