Entries which is sent to the management from A. L. Landria, president of the board, will reach Earl and will be ready for the day. Entries sent in after that date will be void.

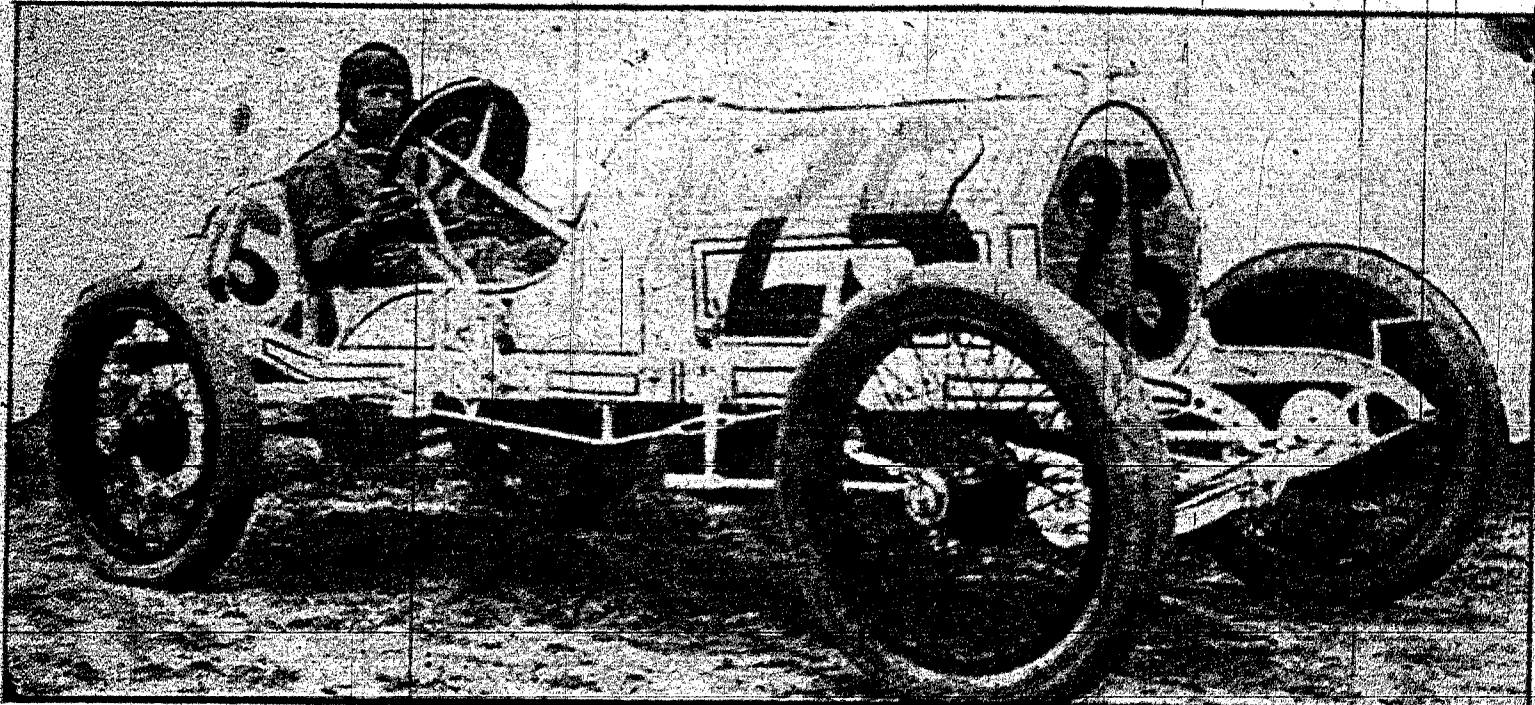

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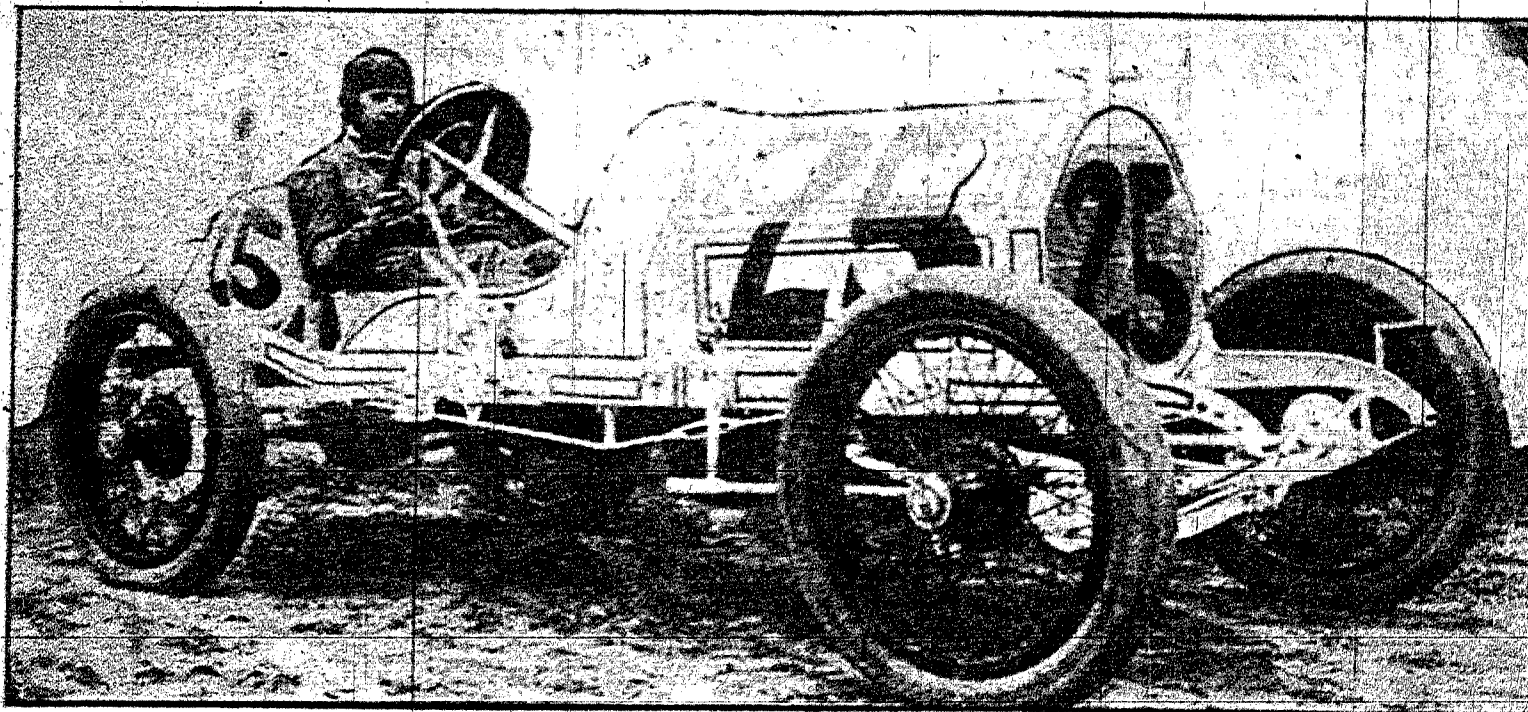
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
