## OLDFIELD MEETS DEFEAT.

"Speed Phenom" Barney Meets Waterloo on Arizona Track.

The high-flying automobile racing colors of the famous Barney Oldfield have at last been a trifle dimmed, the dimming process being accomplished by a stock car against his huge racing machine, and the stock car was driven by an amateur, little more than a boy at that. The race took place on a track in Arizona and was a three-mile handicap, with Oldfield at scratch, and the stock car—on its entrance into local auto circles, driven by Will Callahan—was given thirty-five seconds start, the two other entries, which were distanced soon, being granted greater time allowances. The finish was a hot one, but the Speedwell stock car finished with a mite of atmosphere between it and Oldfield's ninety-horsepower racer. Later Callahan drove the machine an exhibition mile in 1:10 1-5, a record for stock cars for the track.

Richmond Team Gets Crack First Rush for Anderson Game.
