OLDFIELD ENTERS RACES

WILL DRIVE AT LOUISVILLE

FEARLESS AUTOIST PROMISES TO APPEAR BEFORE SHRINERS IN INDIANAPOLIS-MADE MOTOR, THE NATIONAL.

That the name of Barney Oldfield and Indianapolis are now coupled together in automobile circles is again evidenced by Louisville's stand.

Homer George, who has charge of the motor races to take place at Louisville June 9, when the Shriners meet in convention sessions, made a special trip here yesterday to persuade Barney to drive there. Oldfield, who is living here now, consented, and he will be featured as the main attraction, although many other famous drivers are booked.

Oldfield next asked the National Automobile Company of this city to rush to completion his private cars. This is impossible by that early date, but the company consented to loan him the racers it has now entered in the Wilkesbarre hill climb in Pennsylvania.
