ST. PAUL, Minn., Aug. 15. — Barney Oldfield, speed demon, drove his new Stearns in the first race of the year at St. Paul, Minn., July 15. On the State Fair track at St. Paul he made a mile in fifty-six seconds flat—two seconds above the track record now held by Christie. In his Stearns Oldfield does not look like the man who tore around the tracks in the Peerless Green Dragon. The Stearns is a comparatively high car, looking like the ordinary automobile. The Green Dragon was a low, small-wheeled, typical racing car.

Considering that Barney has only had his car a short time, the record made on

the St. Paul track is a wonderful one. It is predicted by the cracks that before the season is over Oldfield will have established many new records.

In driving Oldfield is the same reckless "devil" as of old. On the turns he takes chances that make the crowd hold its breath in horror, awaiting the shock of collision. It is on the turns, in fact, that Oldfield is at his best; in the St. Paul races his car often lost, but on the turns, when the clouds of dust obscured the vision, he would make it all up and come in on the stretch victorious.

Oldfield is perhaps the highest-priced auto racer in the world. At the St. Paul meet he was guaranteed \$1,000 before entering.
