HARROUN, IN MARMON CAR, WINS 100-MILE RACE—AITKEN WITHDRAWS NATIONAL IN THE EIGHTIETH MILE.

NEW ORLEANS, La., Nov. 21.—Barney Oldfield, in his 200-horse-power Benz, today broke the local track record for one mile at the Fair Grounds course, when he made the distance in 54 seconds, thus clipping one-fifth of a second off the record made last February by De Palma. The second day's races of the New Orleans Automobile Club proved much better than the first in every way.

Kirscher, a German driver, brought to this country by W. H. Pickens, and who drives the latter's Darracq, won a ten-mile handicap and in a match race with Oldfield for five miles lost only by about the width of a tire.

The last event of the afternoon, the 100-mile race, was won by Ray Harroun of Chicago in his Marmon car. Johnny Aitken, in his National, looked a sure winner, and at the end of eighty miles led Harroun by a full mile. Up to this time his car ran without a stop, but ignition trouble caused him to withdraw, and Harroun won. Basle, in his Renault, was second. Summaries:

First Event (ten-mile handicap)—Darracq (Kirscher), scratch, won; National (Aitken), 25 seconds handicap, second; Marmon (Harroun), scratch, third. Time, 10:35.

Second Event—Effort to lower world's fifty-mile record by Barney Oldfield in Benz car; tire blew in eighteenth mile and trial declared off. First fifteen miles made in 14:04.

Third Event (five miles, Southern championship; open to amateurs or chauffeurs)—National (Speer), won; Marmon (Swoboda), second; Buick (Walker), third. Time, 5:30.

Fourth Event (mile trial for Fair Grounds track record of :54 1-5, held by De Palma)—Benz (Oldfield) lowered record one-fifth second.

Fifth Event (ten miles, free-for-all handicap)—Renault (Basle), 1:15 handicap, won; Darracq (Kirschner), scratch, second; Marmon (Harroun), 40 seconds handicap, third.

Eighth Event (100 miles)—Marmon (Harroun), won; Renault (Basle), second; Chalmers-Detroit (Cowell), third. Time, 1:47:14.
