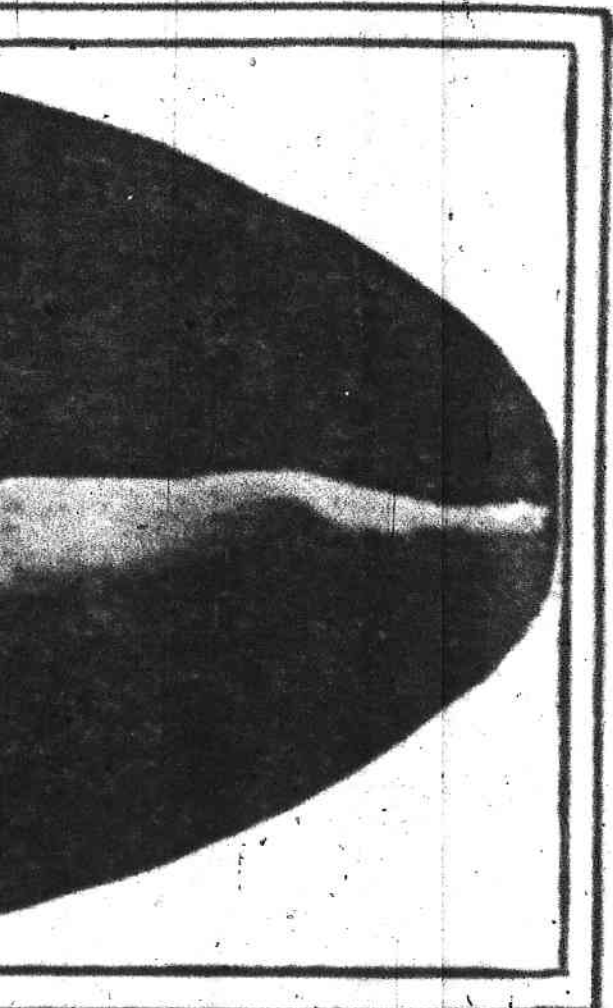

AUTO RACER MAKES DENIAL

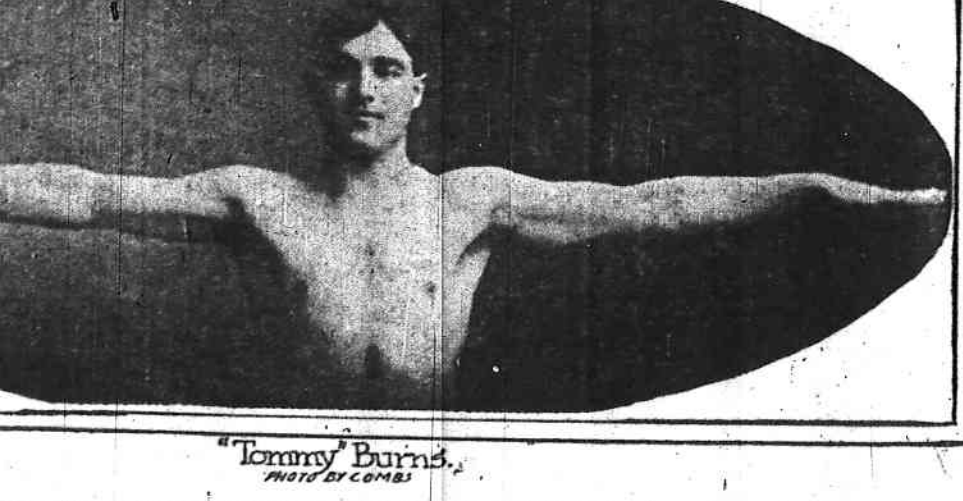
PORTLAND, Ore., July 5.—Barney Oldfield, the automobile racer, who was arrested here yesterday at the instance of the Evening Telegram, on a charge of obtaining money under false pretenses in connection with last Tuesday's race meet, denies the accusation emphatically. Oldfield said to the Associated Press:

"Every entry was certainly made just as was represented on the program. I was given to understand by my manager that a majority of the board of directors of the local automobile club sanctioned the use of their names in connection with the meet. The charge is absolutely groundless, as will be proved when the case comes to trial, if it ever does."

The information filed by the Telegram is general in its accusation. The paper prints charges that Oldfield and his manager used the name of a local automobile club for the purpose of gaining prestige; that this use was without the sanction of the club; that the promoters of the race meet offered a card of races when they knew none of the entries listed intended to participate and that in general the meet was a fake.

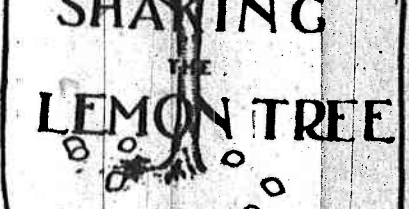
