SAVIN BREAKS AUTO RECORD.

Drives Stock Touring Car Fifty Miles in 1:06:19.

CHICAGO, July 3.—All world's records for fifty miles for stock touring cars, were broken by Ollie Savin of Texas in the fifty-mile Endurance Derby, the feature of the automobile races at Hawthorne, today. His time was 1:06:19. The former record was 1:08:51, made at St. Louis last month. Five of the nine starters finished the race. W. J. McDonald was second and G. Rogers third. The other events resulted as follows:

Three-mile open, to cars listing \$1,000 to \$2,000, fully equipped—O. C. Friend, first; C. V. Rogers, second; W. R. Willett, third; time, 5:46.

Hawthorne Handicap, free-for-all—A. C. Webb (scratch), first; Ollie Savin (45 seconds), second; Fred Good (1 minute), third; time, 5:38. Six others started and finished.

The three preliminary heats in the Illinois Sweepstakes, a three-mile race, were run off, and today's winners will meet in the finals tomorrow.

C. A. Cozey won the first heat in 4:24 4-5. The second heat went to A. C. Webb in 4:05, while Barney Oldfield captured the third heat in 3:53 2-5.
