## BARNEY WINS IN NATIONAL

LOUISVILLE, Ky., June 10.—Fitful  
rainstorms and heavy black clouds marred  
the automobile races in honor of the visit-  
ing Shriners at Douglas park yesterday,  
though there were no accidents. Five  
events were run, Lewis Strang winning  
two, Barney Oldfield and Tilford Cowell  
one each. Oldfield beat Strang by one-  
eighth of a mile in their first competition.  
He drove a six-cylinder National, the  
same that won fame in the Wilkes-Barre  
(Pa.) hill climb, and Strang drove the  
Cobe trophy 30-horse power Buick. No  
records were broken. The attendance was

Sixth race—Not run.  
Seventh race—Five miles; \$100 to winner; Til-
