

Barney Oldfield Has Named New Racing Car National Old Glory

Barney Oldfield has named his new racing car, just built by the National Motor Vehicle Company, of this city, in which he took his first practice spin about the streets of Indianapolis today.

It is the National Old Glory, and that it will live up to its name in appearance can be seen at a glance. After his first ride today, although he attempted nothing in the way of speed, Oldfield expressed the opinion that he will smash all records with the new machine. He is of the opinion that he will like the car's work and its appearance better than any he ever drove before.

The National Old Glory will attract the attention of the populace wherever it is driven. On both sides of the hood will be painted a big flag in the brightest red, white and blue obtainable. The remainder of the car will also be painted to carry out the flag idea as much as possible. Oldfield has had his Winton Bullet and his Peerless Green Dragon, but he thinks he will like his National Old Glory the best of all.

He is now negotiating with race promoters at Columbus, O., for exhibitions in that city July 2 and 3 and he has signed a contract for exhibitions at Detroit July 4 and 5. He expects to do something sensational in his first appearance in the National Old Glory.

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
