**Officials Protest It, However, and
 Barney Loses Prize.**

Barney Oldfield has returned from Co-
 lumbus, where he went to drive in the
 big auto race meeting. He was barred
 from most of the events because it was
 alleged that his machine, the National
 Old Glory, was a racing car and not a
 stock car. He finished first in the Ohio
 state championship race, for touring cars
 at ten miles, Saturday, but did not receive
 the prize. The officials protested his win-
 ning, although, it is said, his car in this
 race was a regular 35-horse power Nation-
 al touring car that came up to the re-
 quirements in every way. Oldfield drove
 five miles in 4:43 in an effort to reduce
 DePalma's circular track record of 4:26.
