According to present plans and rumors arrangements are being made for a great airship race next fall between Carl Fisher of this city, Barney Oldfield, the champion track auto driver of the world, and Horace Wild, who has had his machine for a week past at the White City. While the race is still unsettled it was practically decided by the three men during the stay of Oldfield in this city that such an event would be pulled off this fall.


