According to present plans and rumors
arrangements are being made for a great
airship race next fall between Carl Fisher
of this city, Barney Oldfield, the champion
track auto driver of the world, and Horace
Wild, who has had his machine for a week
past at the White City. While the race
is still unsettled it was practically de-
cided by the three men during the stay of
Oldfield in this city that such an event
would be pulled off this fall.

Mr. Oldfield, while in this city preparing
for the races held on Memorial day at the
Fair Grounds, placed an order with Fisher
for the largest airship that has ever been
built, and at that time it was suggested
that such a race be held. Wild was ap-
proached in the matter and agreed to such
a race.

The plan at present is to hold the race
within thirty days after Oldfield gets his
ship from the factory. It will be held in
connection with some auto race meet and
will be for a purse of \$5,000.

An effort was made to get a confirma-
tion from Mr. Fisher last night, but he
was not to be found, and as Mr. Oldfield
had left the city in his car for French
Lick it was impossible to get anything
from this source.


