**OLDFIELD BESTS CHRISTIE.**

**Barney Winner of Feature Event in Buffalo Races.**

**BUFFALO, August 9.**—Barney Oldfield defeated Walter Christie in a three-mile race, the feature of Saturday's automobile races at Ft. Erie. Oldfield used his new German racer Benz, while Christie drove his 200-horse power record-breaker. Christie frequently passed Oldfield on the straightaways but Barney negotiated the turns in a manner to overcome this advantage and gained something besides.

Christie, in a mile exhibition, lowered the track record of 543.5 seconds to 54 seconds. Chevrolet also made a new record, covering the fifty miles in :51:19, the previous record for an oval course being :51:22. In this race, a one-hundred-mile event, F. S. Lorimer, Chevrolet's competitor, came to grief. The accident occurred in the ninety-sixth mile. A dense cloud of dust enveloped the course and the accident was not discovered until some seconds after the Frenchman, who had been leading by a narrow margin, flashed past the stand alone. Lorimer was found under the wreck of his machine near the three-quarter pole. He was badly cut and bruised but no bones were broken.
